Legislative Update

Mr. Bartlett provided a legislative update on various bills in the budget session.

Facility Update

- Mr. Bartlett provided a facility update on the following:
- Little Powder The well is established, and the flow rate and quality are satisfactory. The anticipated date for bidding on the project is early April.
- Aquatic Center Structural steel placement, plumbing, and electrical rough-in are ongoing; locker room pads are poured, and block walls are going up; pool excavation is anticipated to begin March 15; the District is currently on time and budget.
- Campbell County High School Most Cost-Effective Remedy Update The District has sent revisions to the update for the 2020 MCER Study to the design team; a final draft is expected by early next week, and once the work is complete, the document is to be included on the Facilities Commission March 27-29 Agenda, findings to be presented as part of Chapter 3, Section 8 Adequacy Hearing, which will be to determine if the School Facilities commission deems Campbell County High School inadequate, and at that time they should also recognize a remedy.
- Summer Maintenance Projects All anticipated major maintenance projects are bid
 for either design or construction, and the bids are currently being reviewed to ensure
 they align with the engineer's cost estimates. The District is working on establishing
 the final major maintenance budget and project list.

Public Comments

Public comments included appreciation for the Staff Communicators Assembly and all the pre-work that goes into it and consideration given to staff for being able to have a say, thankfulness for Dr. Reznicek and the work done for the blood draw and wellness programs, concern about the open positions we have in the District, which include 52 classified and 28 certified posted on the District website, great appreciation working for Campbell County School District and for the Board because the kids deserve the best, and concerns with the transportation department.

Trustee Celebrations

Chairman Ochs celebrated the good weather for allowing a lot of construction work to be done at the Aquatic Center, but prayers for rain are also needed for the ranchers.
