Dr. Ayers listed the topics for the meeting: 1) Welcome; 2) Summer Enrichment and Summer School; 3) Campbell County High School Facility Update

- 1. **Welcome** Dr. Ayers welcomed new team member Dave Bartlett, Associate Superintendent of Instructional Support.
- 2. **Summer School and Summer Enrichment** Deputy Superintendent Kirby Eisenhauer and Special Education Services Director Luke Danforth
 - Mr. Eisenhauer shared with the board that secondary summer school was offered for grades 9-12 beginning on May 31, 2023, and ran for 16 days. Content-certified staff taught Math, English, Biology, and US History, with 225 students attending. Seniors took advantage of the opportunity to complete their coursework to attain their diplomas. There were many celebrations, including Campbell County High School being a gracious host, the great work of transportation, food services, and custodial being noted and appreciated, ESL support strengthened with the addition of an ESL teacher, and Schoology allowing teachers and students to see what was needed to complete the course to meet standards and pace themselves. The elementary summer enrichment session has 938 students recommended by teachers, and projects will be presented to the public at the end of the session. The elementary summer school session will start soon, with 589 students scheduled to attend.
 - Mr. Danforth provided information on Extended School Year (ESY) services for special education students on IEPs. Sixty students are scheduled to attend, and adaptive PE was added this year. The Community Living Program is a supplemental program that provides learning opportunities for students on IEPs with neuro-diverse challenges. Most of the instruction is hands-on and activities where students can identify and improve personal social interaction and independent living skills.
- 3. **Campbell County High School Facility Update** Mr. Bartlett provided information regarding the high school's issues with the sanitary sewer system and the negative impact on instruction. The District has retained Clearwater Contracting, which specializes in this area, to assess the situation and develop a short-term fix addressing necessary repairs to have the building ready for students and staff in the fall of 2023.
