#### **Graduation Rate:**

**Goal:** TBHS Students will meet or exceed the state average graduation rate.

- ◆ Counselors and Principals meet with students each semester to ensure students are on track with credits and grades.
- ◆ Continue to utilize our English and Math Interventionists to provide content specific support during the regular school day.
- ◆ Assign a TBHS staff member as a "chaser" to those seniors who may need extra support, and another positive connection to ensure they graduate on time.

- Present all Juniors with practice ACT testing experiences during the fall and spring of Junior year.
- ◆ Continue to embed ACT practice questions into the regular classroom setting.
- ◆ Continue to have content teachers ensure alignment between content standards and ACT readiness benchmarks.
- ◆ Encourage Juniors to take the ACT preparation class.

**Goal:** TBHS students will meet or exceed the state average in all content areas on WYTOPP Assessments.

- ◆ Improve student performance on WY-TOPP Interim and Summative assessments, as well as district common assessments.
- ◆ Continue to look at ways to better the testing schedule for students.

#### **Post-Secondary Readiness:**

**Goal:** Students will be proficient or advanced in all state assessments to demonstrate college and career readiness.

◆ Targeted instruction of essential standards of content areas specific to post-secondary readiness.
