



The Campbell County School District Seal of Bilinguality Committee is made up of language teachers and administrators with the purpose of creating the criteria for approval and adoption by the Campbell County School District Administration and School Board.

The purpose of the Seal of Bilinguality (<https://sealofbilinguality.org/>) is to recognize on student diplomas upon graduation from high school that the student has met all the criteria put forth that demonstrates high level of proficiency in more than one language -

through listening, speaking, reading and writing. The Seal of Bilinguality also exemplifies linguistic competence for students who are career and/or college ready.

After committee meetings over the past years, these are the recommendations. The following are the proposed criteria to be met in order to qualify for the Seal of Bilinguality. Students would need to meet 1 of the criteria in English and Language other than English.
