

## 6165-R Student Projects Requested by the Public

Anyone requesting a project be completed by a student, or group of students, must submit the request in writing, along with detailed plans, to the instructor in charge.

Instructors will examine public requests for student work and approve or deny them based on the following criteria:

- Will not detract from required instruction or curriculum,
- Value to the school district or public,
- Relevance to the curriculum,
- Student interest,
- Student/staff time available,
- Complexity of the project,
- Material and equipment requirements,
- Nature of the project, and
- Other factors determined by the instructor to be valid considerations.

If the instructor determines the project is worthy of the class time involved and fulfills the needs of the student(s), the project may be assigned to the student(s) with the following stipulations:

- All materials, parts and other actual expenses involved will be the responsibility of the requesting party.
- Because projects of this nature are primarily for instructional purposes, no delivery date can be guaranteed.
- While every effort will be made to perform quality workmanship, the quality of the project cannot be guaranteed.
- Payment by the requesting party for labor or services is not permitted and will not be accepted by student(s) or staff. Contributions may be made by the requesting party to the school or a school organization.
